

IICODE 3 Installation and Operation Instructions 3955 Siren Amplifier Connector Kit

IMPORTANT! Read all instructions before installing and using. Installer: This manual must be delivered to the end user.



Failure to install or use this product according to manufacturer's recommendations may result in property damage, serious injury, and/ or death to those you are seeking to protect!




Figure 1 - Kit Contents

Installation and Mounting:

Note: Verify that all contents are present in the kit before installing or removing items from vehicle.



WARNING!

Rider and passenger safety depend upon the correct installation of this kit. Use the appropriate service manual procedures. Improper installation of this kit could result in death or serious injury.

Note: This instruction sheet references service manual information. A service manual for the year and model motorcycle is required for this installation.

- Step 1. Remove main fuse. See the service manual.
- Step 2. Locate siren amplifier.
- **Step 3.** Push the protective boot up the harness, exposing the connector and wiring.
- Step 4. Locate (PK/O) wire in terminal 3C, tag wire with the # 1.
- **Step 5.** Following the Delphi Metri-Pack Sealed Connectors, remove all terminals from connector and discard connector. See the service manual.
- **Step 6.** Remove the Delphi Metri-Pack terminals. Using wire cutters, cut the wire just above the terminal and discard.

Note: Leave as much wiring on harness end as possible when removing terminal.

- **Step 7.** Strip the recommended length of insulation off each wire.
- **Step 8.** Crimp the new terminals to the wiring.
- Step 9. If necessary, unlock new Molex MX150 Connector.
- **Step 10.** See Figure 3. Install all terminal ends into new connector. Following Table 1, install all terminals.
- Step 11. Install seal pins (2) in terminals 11 and 12.
- Step 12. Set connector lock.
- **Step 13.** Pull the protective boot over the new connector.
- **Step 14.** If siren amplifier is installed, connect new connector into siren amplifier.
- Step 15. Install main fuse. See the service manual.




Figure 2 - Delphi Metri-Pack Sealed Connector




Figure 3 - Molex MX150 12 Position Connector
